providing a mailing list, a newsletter for members available via the ENOTHE website, organising workshops at ENOTHE-conferences, disseminating information via occupational therapy associations, institutions and journals, and evaluating the potential for continuing at the end of 2006.

- establish an European Network of Occupational Therapy Research and Occupational Science with cooperating centres of special competences all over Europe
- increase the number of multi-national research projects.
- continuously enhance the evidence for best practice in occupational therapy and occupational health promotion

## How to participate?

- Send an e-mail (the content doesn't matter) to <a href="ecotros-subscribe@yahoogroups.com">ecotros-subscribe@yahoogroups.com</a>. You will receive an automatic answer, which you should reconfirm by replying. When you are a list member, you introduce yourself with your (1) name, (2) e-mail address, (3) country, (4) institution, and (5) your involvement or interest in projects in Occupational Therapy Research, Occupational Science or interdisciplinary research. Now you can send e-mails via <a href="ecotros@yahoogroups.com">ecotros@yahoogroups.com</a> with information, questions and comments to all members of the list. The number of list members increases step by step.
- Additionally to the continuous interchange, online-surveys about new information and projects will regularly take place via the list.
- A regular newsletter with the results of the survey will be disseminated via the list. This onlinenewsletter is to facilitate the continuous interchange on the mailing list, to keep members up to date and to report the progress of the ECOTROS-project.

## What is the benefit to you?

- As a person interested in research you can have quick access to projects and knowledge not yet published. You might also obtain hints from experts in the relevant field and possibly find cooperation partners for future projects.
- As a teacher you can keep your students and yourself up to date. You might provide them with information about the newest trends in Occupational Therapy Research, Occupational Science or interdisciplinary projects all over Europe.
- As a representative for policy in Occupational Therapy and Occupational Health Promotion, you
  can have quick access to experts. These experts will provide evidence for established or new
  working fields. You can then base your political initiatives and your negotiations with decision
  makers within health care systems on scientific, up-to-date evidence.
- When seeking for funding you might be able to quickly recruit an international network of experts as this is required to apply for EU-funding.
